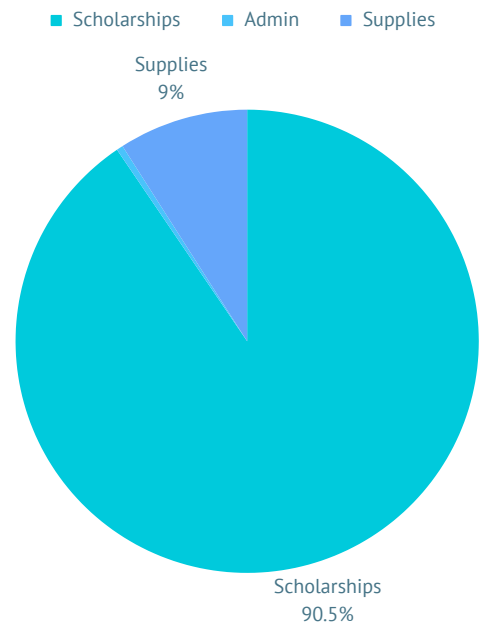

ABOUT OWRF

The OWRF is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization with the mission to support and provide educational opportunities related to water and irrigated agriculture. The foundation was created by the Oregon Water Resources Congress (OWRC) in October 2022 and is currently being administered by OWRC.

The foundation's primary focus is a scholarship program to assist students pursuing water, agriculture, or other natural resources related fields (currently undergraduate level only). To date, OWRF has raised \$32,000, and awarded three scholarships in 2023, ranging from \$5,000 to \$2,000. Available funds will allow for similar awards in 2024 but additional donations are needed to support higher award amounts and awards in future years.

The next scholarship application period is tentatively scheduled to open in early 2024 with awards to be determined by June 2024. Future awards will be offered annually as funds allow.
